SUNDAY MORNING SERMON NATHAN WARD

Our Eyes Are on You: Jehoshaphat's Prayer (2 Chron 20.6-12)

Introduction: The God to whom we pray is a God who is there in times of trial. He is a God who hears the downtrodden and overcome, lifting them up and making them victorious. He is a God who specializes in turning weakness into strength for the humble who trust in Him. Jehoshaphat finds himself in just such a situation and makes just such an appeal.

I. Context

- A. Of the Kings of Israel and Judah
 - 1. One of the few good kings
 - 2. Prays to and relies on God
 - 3. In contrast with his foolish alliance with Ahab (ch 19)
- B. Of the Account
- 1. The Enemies a coalition of nations comprising "a great multitude" (v 2)
- 2. "After this..."
 - a. That is, Jehoshaphat's religious reforms (19.4-11; cf. 32.1)
 - b. He and the people turn to God (cf. 17.3-4; 18.4; 19.3)

II. Contents

- A. Praise and complaint (v 6)
 - 1. Praise God's sovereign power, including authority over nations
 - 2. Complaint implied in the rhetorical questions
- B. Historical retrospective (vv 7-10)
 - 1. Promise to Abraham gift of the land
- 2. Prayer of Solomon God's presence in the Temple (2 Chron 6.24-29; 7.10-12)
- 3. Previous obedience to show mercy to the Moabites (Deut 2.9, 19)
- C. Plea (vv 10-12)
- 1. "And now" common opening of petition in OT prayer
- 2. No specific request, attempt to convince God, or manipulate the situation
- 3. Confession of helplessness and hopelessness and implicit trust in God
