In 1927 Babe Ruth hit an amazing 60 homeruns in one

season. That became the record and standard for over three decades. In 1961, 34 years later, Roger Maris hit 61 homeruns that season. However, the season was longer and Maris played in more games than Ruth did in 1927. As a result, in the history books, there was always an Asterisk by Maris' name. He hit more homeruns in a season, but he played in more games.

• "How has it happened that the people who proclaim forgiveness of sin don't seem to have any sins to be forgiven of themselves? How has a church that once was the happy possession of common fishermen, prostitutes, and tax collectors now become the home of the spiritual elite? We no longer need salvation. The unbeliever receives the forgiveness of sin but the believer must have simply stop sinningIt is thought that salvation is for those who need to be saved, not those who are already saved" (John Fischer, "12 Steps for the Recovering Pharisee—like Me).
How do we destroy the little Pharisee in us?
1. Salvation is an that we each need all the time (1 Pet 1:5, 9; 2:2)
 Many of these Bible heroes were great sinners after their spiritual victories Noah was drunk after the flood; David committed adultery after killing the giant We need the Lord every day
 "If Bible tells the whole story, then we need to tell the whole story, too, about our lives. We tell the whole story about our successes and failures for the same reason these lessons are in Scriptures. We tell the whole story so that it becomes very clear to anyone who might care to notice that we are not the heroes of the message we bring. We are participants in the story of which Jesus Christ is the beginning, the middle and the end." (Fischer)
 We get it right sometimes and we get it wrong sometimes. When we get it right, it is because we are depending on God's strength and presence in our lives, not on anything in and of ourselves. When we get it wrong, it is because we are looking to ourselves and not to God.
