



Take a look at the fingerprints on your hands. Did you know...

- 1. Your fingerprints are unique to <u>you</u>?
- 2. They help <u>identify</u> who you are?

With that in mind, let's read Romans 1:1-4 together...

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he <u>promised</u> beforehand through his <u>prophets</u> in the holy Scriptures, concerning his Son...

In the God-breathed Scriptures, it was promised over and over again that a Savior would come. The Old Testament is full of more than 300 references to the coming of Jesus! Those promises and prophecies formed a kind of fingerprint so that people could recognize the Son of God when he finally arrived. Listen to what Jesus did and said in Luke 4:16-21:

And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read. And the scroll of the prophet <u>Isaiah</u> was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has anointed me
to proclaim good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives

and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed,

to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."



And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been <u>fulfilled</u> in your hearing."

Who is Jesus? He's the One identified by that Old Testament fingerprint. The One God was promising would come. The One who fulfilled all those prophecies. Here are just a few to get us thinking...

- 1. He was part of Abraham's family tree (Matt 1:1; Gen 22:18)
- 2. He was born in <u>Bethlehem</u> (Matt 2:3-6; Mic 5:2)
- 3. He was born around the time of a terrible <u>tragedy</u> (Matt 2:16-18; Jer 31:15)

Jesus came to "fulfill" the Law and the Prophets (Matt 5:17). Let's talk about it...

•	How amazing is it that we all have unique fingerprints? Is that an accident? Whose idea was it?
•	Let's read Romans 1:1-2 again together.  - When Paul described himself as "an apostle," what did he mean by that?

•	We heard Jesus read from (what we call) Isaiah 61:1-2 and in Luke 4:21, Jesus said "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." What did he mean by that? What does it mean to "fulfill" a prophecy?
•	Let's think about those three prophecies about Jesus' birth that were mentioned in our video:
