- A. Seeing Jesus is one of the great _____ of the poets (Job 19:26-27; Psalm 17:5).

- B. Seeing Jesus is one of the supreme _____ of heaven (John 14:19; see Revelation 5; cp. 21:22-23).

"A little while longer and the world will see Me no more, but _____ Me. Because I live, you will live also" (John 14:19, NKJV).

- C. Seeing Jesus in glorified bodies will be a moment of _____ inexpressible (cp. Philippians 3:20-21; 2 Corinthians 5:8-9; 1 John 3:2).

"Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for _____ as He is" (1 John 3:2, NKJV).
