The Introduction to Grace: Luke 5

Luke 5:12-15

While He was in one of the cities. behold. there was a man covered with leprosy; and when he saw Jesus, he fell on his face and implored Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean." ¹³ And He stretched out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." And immediately the leprosy left him. ¹⁴ And He ordered him to tell no one, "But go and show yourself to the priest and make an offering for your cleansing, just as Moses commanded, as a testimony to them." ¹⁵ But the news about Him was spreading even farther, and large crowds were gathering to hear *Him* and to be healed of their sicknesses.

Luke 5:27-39

After that He went out and noticed a tax ollector named Levi sitting in the tax booth, nd He said to him, "Follow Me." ²⁸ And e left everything behind, and got up nd *began* to follow Him. ²⁹ And Levi gave a ig reception for Him in his house; and there as a great crowd of tax collectors and ther people who were reclining at the able with them. ³⁰ The Pharisees and their cribes began grumbling at His disciples, aying, "Why do you eat and drink with the ax collectors and sinners?" ³¹ And Jesus nswered and said to them, "It is not those who are well who need a physician, but hose who are sick. ³² I have not come to call he righteous but sinners to repentance." ³ And they said to Him, "The disciples of ohn often fast and offer prayers, the lisciples of the Pharisees also do the same, but Yours eat and drink." ³⁴ And Jesus said to hem, "You cannot make the attendants of he bridegroom fast while the bridegroom is vith them, can you? ³⁵ But *the* days will ome; and when the bridegroom is taken way from them, then they will fast in those lays." ³⁶ And He was also telling them a arable: "No one tears a piece of cloth from new garment and puts it on an old arment; otherwise he will both tear the ew, and the piece from the new will not natch the old. ³⁷ And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise the new wine will burst the skins and it will be spilled out, and the skins will be ruined. ³⁸ But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. ³⁹ And no one, after drinking old wine wishes for new: for he says, 'The old is good enough.'"
