"Blessed" is the first word in the first	sentences of Jesus' sermon. Clearly, he
wants to draw our attention to a very importa	ant point. But what is that point?
"Blessed" in the Bible isn't the same thing	as "" Being a "blessed"
person doesn't depend on all of the circums	tances and situations of my life being exactly
the way I want. Instead, think of being "bless	ed" in the way Jesus described a servant in
Matthew 25:21: "	, good and faithful servant." A "blessed" persor
is someone God looks at and says, "Well dor	ne. That's what I'm looking for. He is on the
right track. She is following my lead." The "bl	essed" person is living God's way because
their heart has been aligned with God and th	neir character is bearing fruit that honors God.

The Character of a Disciple

So what does it look like to have a heart aligned with God and a character that honors him	ւ?

"Blessed are those who, for they shall be comforted.	
"Blessed are the, for they shall inherit the earth.	
"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for, for	
they shall be satisfied.	
"Blessed are the, for they shall receive mercy.	
"Blessed are the in heart, for they shall see God.	
"Blessed are the, for they shall be called sons of God.	
"Blessed are those who are persecuted righteousness' sake, for theirs is	
the kingdom of heaven.	
"Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evi	il
against you falsely on account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in	n
heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you."

For Class & Family Discussion:

- 1. Matthew 5 isn't the first time we hear this "blessed" language from God. To help us more fully understand what God means by that word, check out Psalm 1:1-3. In your own words, what does it mean to be "blessed"?
- 2. Let's work our way through these "blessed" statements Jesus uses as the introduction to his sermon. Why does God look at this person and say, "Well done?" How has his heart been aligned with God? In what way is her character bearing fruit that honors God? And as a result, how is God going to bless them?

 - "Blessed are those who mourn" -
 - "Blessed are the meek" -
 - "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness" -
 - "Blessed are the merciful" -
 - "Blessed are the pure in heart" -

 - Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake" -
