### Questions for ch 18

This chapter begins with "After these things," which seems to be a time signature. Other times this is used is: 4:1; 7:9; 9:12; 15:5; 19:1 and 20:3.

1. The declaration that Babylon has fallen, first found in 14:8 and repeated in 18:2, would mean what to the Christians who first read this?
2. Why does the Lord want His people to come out of Babylon (4)?
3. The principle of reaping what you sow (Gal 6:7) is demonstrated how in vs. 6-8?
4. Kings and merchants will mourn over the fall of Babylon. Why?
5. Three times the double, "woe, woe" is found in this chapter. List the places.
6. Notice the great contrast in emotions found in 16-20. What do you see?
7. In a couple of places this chapter points to a quick judgment of Babylon. Can you find them?
8. The last verse of the chapter points to one of the reasons for Babylon's judgment. What is it?
