- 3. The principle of reaping what you sow (Gal 6:7) is demonstrated how in vs. 6-8?
- 4. Kings and merchants will mourn over the fall of Babylon. Why?
- 5. Three times the double, "woe, woe" is found in this chapter. List the places.
- 6. Notice the great contrast in emotions found in 16-20. What do you see?
- 7. In a couple of places this chapter points to a quick judgment of Babylon. Can you find them?
- 8. The last verse of the chapter points to one of the reasons for Babylon's judgment. What is it?
