Second Peter

- 1. Growing closer to the Lord (ch 1)
 - Peter is aware of his impending death (13-15)
 - Peter is aware that he is telling his readers what they already know (1:12-13; 3:1-2)
 - Peter accents the difference from his message and that of false teachers (16-21)
- The benefits of these virtues are highlighted (4-11)
- 2. The judgment toward false teachers is sounded (ch 2)
 - One specific error is destroyed (3:3-16)
- 3. Peter repeats his theme once more:
 - don't be carried away by error (3:17)
 - grow in the Lord (3:18)
